As mathematicians we will start out by looking at place value. We will focus on forming numbers 0-20 correctly and ordering them in sequences. We will then be developing our addition and subtraction skills. We will use challenges to solve problems.

As the computer experts of tomorrow we will start out by looking at algorithms.

As athletes we will be working ball skills including the use of our fine and gross motor skills and teamwork.

As geographers we will look at the changing seasons and try to answer questions like; where do leaves go in winter? And; why does it get dark so early in winter?

As musicians we will be listening to a range of music and describing the way it changes how we feel.

In RE we will be trying to answer the question; 'Can you tell what somebody believes by the way they look?'

As artists and designers we will be looking at colour mixing and collage to make Autumn scenes. We will also work on our skills in using construction materials.

As scientists we will be looking at the seasons and how animals adapt. We will be looking at the question; 'How do hedgehogs know when to hibernate?'. We will also start to look at scientific investigations.

As writers we will be working on our handwriting skills including letter formation to help us start to use cursive writing. We will work on writing captions and using writing to answer questions.

We will read a wide range of stories and will start to use some of the sentences from these to write and edit our own sentence work.

In PSHCE we will be discussing new beginnings and talking about the new school year.

As readers we will read 'Last Stop on Market Street' by Matt De La Pena and 'Bog Baby' by Jeanne Willis as a class. We will have the opportunity to change our own reading book up to 3 times a week.
