As readers and writers we will be:

Developing our listening skills and responding to both fiction and non-fiction texts.

Sharing the Library books that we have chosen on weekly visits.

Using our phonic awareness and knowledge; writing words with more independence as we begin to construct simple sentences

Continuing to learn new letter sounds and learn letter names/upper case letters; recognising them and their corresponding lower case counterpart.

Developing our fine motor skills; using the activities in provision to strengthen the muscles in our fingers and remembering how we need to hold our pencils and paint brushes.

Developing our story telling techniques through Traditional Tales and Helicopter Stories.
